The Organ to be cleaned and thoroughly overhauled.  
All pipes to be removed and all parts to be brushed free from dirt and dust. The Pipes to be capped and brushed out, and when replaced the speech reset and carefully tuned and regulated.

The Reeds to have special attention, the tongues and shallots to be reburndished and when replaced carefully regulated.

The Pneumatic Action to be overhauled, regulated and adjusted; all motors to be examined, and any faulty ones to be relathered.

The general Console Action to be taken apart, cleaned and overhauled, and special attention given to the free working of the Drawstop Action, and also the Piston Action. The exhaust pallets of the touch boxes to be regulated to ensure prompt attack and repetition.

The Pedals to be pieced out where necessary and fitted with new felt, springs adjusted and lubricated.

The Pedal Relay to be overhauled. 13 Drawstop Motors to be relathered and the main slides to be made to work freely. The relay for the Great Organ basses to be overhauled, slides made to work freely and the Drawstop Motors relathered.

The three Tremulants to be repaired and adjusted.

The Swell Box shutters to be refitted and made sound, and to carry out such alterations to the main Swell Box as would be likely to meet the requirements of the Organist.

The Blowing Plant to be cleaned and overhauled, and put into thorough working order.

Soundboards to be carefully overhauled, upperboards taken up, dust removed, and the sliders adjusted and made to work freely.

To re-erect the Organ in the Gallery, making such alteration to certain Pedal Violone Pipes, ~~which~~ i.e. lower soundboard, to meet the slope of the roof.

The Organ to be carefully tuned and regulated throughout and left in satisfactory playing order.

To remove all dirt and dust from the interior of the Instrument, such parts as necessary to be dismantled for this purpose. Dismantle the whole of the mechanism to be cleaned thoroughly overhauled generally, and when re-assembled, lubricated, adjusted and regulated.
